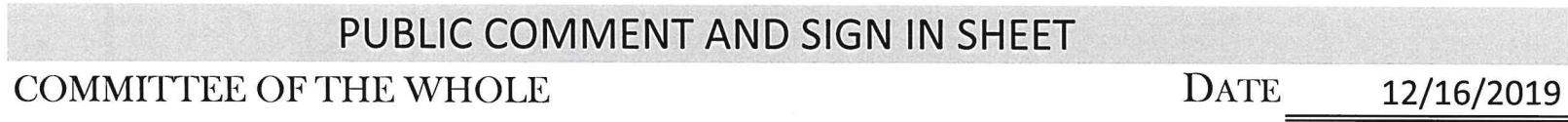

MOTION BY COUNCIL MEMBER SPITZLEY TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM NOVEMBER 18, 2019 AS PRESENTED. MOTION CARRIED 8-0

Public Comment

Ms. Stanaway updated the Committee on the Parks Department discussions for the cemetery office relocation. She informed the Committee that the office at the cemetery will remain open with volunteers Monday through Friday from 8am – 4pm and the office at Foster Community Center will be used for the purchasing of plots.

Discussion/Action

RESOLUTION – Appointment; Melissa Jeffries; Board of Review; Term to Expire June 30, 2020

Ms. Jeffries was not present at the meeting, and Council President Wood explained that the Council was contacted because the appointment needed to be made before the December 10,

2019 Board of Review, and the Administration asked for urgency. The Committee was offered considerations to address it at Committee and then hopefully Ms. Jeffries would arrive later for the Council meeting. Council Member Spitzley asked why the applicant was not present, and Ms. Boak explained she was contact last week and confirmed both meetings, so her absents was a surprise. Council Member Washington note Ms. Jeffries sits on some of the Mayor's advisory boards, and with this recent recommendation for appointment, she asked Ms. Harkins if they were having a hard time getting people to apply. Council President Wood noted that the Board of Review is hard to fill because they only meet twice a year, and that the Mayor's advisory boards are different then the appointments. City Clerk Swope spoke at the DIAS that he spoke to Ms. Jeffries and she had received a letter stating the meeting was Tuesday; which would coincide with the Board of Review date of 12/10, and was on her way to the meetings.

MOTION BY COUNCIL MEMBER HUSSAIN TO APPROVE THE RESOLUTION FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF MELISSA JEFFRIES TO THE BOARD OF REVIEW.

Council Member Jackson asked what meeting was 12/10/2019 and was confirmed it would be the first meeting of the December Board of Review.

RESOLUTION – Ballot Proposal; Parks and Recreation Millage Renewal

Ms. Harkins recapped for the Committee that this was a renewal of the currently millage and will be on the August, 2020 ballot. Council Member Jackson asked if the millage will go towards specific projects, or the spending is left up to the Administration. Ms. Harkins stated the potential projects will go through the Parks Board, then to the Mayor to approve for the budget, then the budget gets reviewed and approved by Council. Council President Wood reminded the Committee that this current request is only to approve the ballot language, the Council cannot use the Dias as a podium to support or not support a ballot initiative. Council Member Spitzley asked if the Administration had plans to do public outreach before it appeared on the ballot. Council Member Spadafore asked the OCA to correct the ballot language to include a comma after 'Clinton' in the first paragraph.

MOTION BY COUNCIL MEMBER SPADAF0RE TO APPROVE THE RESOLUTION FOR THE BALLOT PROPOSAL FOR RENEWAL OF THE PARKS AND RECREATION MILLAGE.

Council President Wood pointed out to the Committee and the public that in 2020 there will also be a trail millage and zoo millage on one of the elections, but not on the same ballot.

WHEREAS, the City of Lansing has moved to eliminate retiree healthcare and to reduce its unfunded liability for post-retirement healthcare and other retirement benefits;

WHEREAS, the City of Lansing has adopted a Corrective Action Plan under Public Act 202 of 2017 and has taken steps to reduce that liability;

WHEREAS, discussions have occurred between the City of Lansing and the 54-A District Court over post-retirement healthcare benefits for District Court Judges;

WHEREAS, an agreement has been reached between the Court and the City subject to City Council approval to eliminate Defined Benefit Retirement Healthcare for newly elected or appointed District Court Judges who were elected and were serving or appointed ~~took the bench~~ on or after July 1, 2016;

WHEREAS, this agreement further provides that District Court Judges elected or appointed on or after July 1, 2016 will be placed in the City's Defined Contribution Retirement Healthcare Savings Account program;

WHEREAS, the 54-A District Court Exempt Employees transitioned to a Defined Contribution Retirement Healthcare Savings Account Program on July 1, 2016 and traditionally the judges' retirement healthcare benefits have mirrored those of the court's exempt employees as contained in the Exempt Employees Summary of Fringe Benefits, including the established commencement dates reflected therein;

WHEREAS, the Mayor has recommended that the agreement reached with the 54th-A-District Court Judges to be adopted by the City Council and implemented by the City and that the Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council hereby approves the City entering into the agreement with the 54-A Judicial district court to provide judges with a retirement healthcare benefit containing the following provisions:

1. To control the City's outstanding post-employment healthcare obligation, newly elected or appointed Judges in District Court 54-A who were elected and serving or appointed ~~have taken the bench~~ on or after July 1, 2016 will not be provided with Defined Benefit retiree healthcare or any post-retirement healthcare benefits except for a healthcare savings plan benefit.

2. Judges who were elected and serving or appointed ~~took the bench~~ on or after July 1, 2016, will be placed into the City's Defined Contribution Retirement Healthcare Savings program with City contribution equal to 4% of each judge's base salary retroactive to July 1, 2016 or the date they were elected and serving or appointed ~~took the bench~~ whichever is later and with immediate vesting. The City will

contribute 4% of base salary into these accounts. The accounts will be established to allow for portability in accordance with plan provisions and IRS regulations.

3. However, any sitting District Judge who was elected and serving or appointed~~took the bench~~ on or before January 1, 20020~~29~~ will not participate in the healthcare savings program but instead will receive and participate in the City's retirement healthcare programs.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Mayor, on behalf of the City, is authorized to sign and execute all necessary documents to effectuate the agreement, subject to prior approval as to form by the City Attorney
