RESOLUTION – Confirmation of Ingham County Appointment of Ayanna Neal to the Joint Position of Ingham County/City of Lansing position on the Community Corrections Advisory Board; Criminal Defense Position; Term to Expire 9/17/2021 (replaces Mick Grewal)

UPDATE – LPD Community Policing - Walnut Park Property

Chief Green confirmed the community policing is in effect, and the office is being used regularly even by the other officers during their shifts in the area. He then report that since June 1, 2020 there have been 80 calls at the complex. Those included:

- 15 medical assistance
- 11 noise complaints
- 7 suspicious person
- 4 welfare checks
- 1 assault

- 1 burglary
- 1 domestic complaint
- 1 child abuse complaint

Chief Green concluded that he was not able to touch base with the apartment manager before this meeting, but has not heard of any major complaints. Council Member Wood asked the Chief if he thought all the commitments for the camera's, security and the dedicated office has been met, and the confirmed. Council Member Wood asked if the cameras were registered with SCRAMM, and Chief Green stated he would confirm that. Council Member Wood asked the Chief to check to see if the management is working with the CPO on rental background check. Council Member Wood concluded her questions by asking if they could look into the senior housing security and safety in their parking lots.

Council Member Jackson asked Chief Green what he thought the most serious issues were on the site, and he responded by stating noise complaints.

The public was invited to speak at this time; no public comment at this time.

Other

Council Member Garza asked about the policies used for medical calls made by the LPD. Chief Green explained they have a PRT (Person Require Treatment) response and briefly outlined their procedures for immediate medical attention if needed.

Council Member Wood asked Chief Green if he was aware or his officers were aware of a recent complaint the Council got on mini bikes and go carts on the non-motorized Waverly path along with residential streets in the area. Chief Green confirmed they were aware of issues in the spring, but he would double check to make sure the officers are continue to look out for them.

Council Member Jackson asked for any updates on Moores Park enforcement and the Chief acknowledged the recent activities and would reach out for updates. He did note that currently there is no community policing officer in that area due to an injury.
