MOTION BY COUNCIL MEMBER WASHINGTON TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM AUGUST 21, 2018. MOTION CARRIED 2-0.

Council Member Spadafore confirmed the hearing was held, and there were no public comments. Mr. Malvetis noted it is a regulatory requirement and needs to be done.

MOTION BY COUNCIL MEMBER WASHINGTON TO APPROVE THE ORDINANCE FOR THE POST CONSTRUCTION STORM WATER MANAGEMENT. MOTION CARRIED 2-0.

RESOLUTION - Public Improvement IV, Stabler Street Reconstruction Project

Council Member Spadafore recapped the project and Public Service confirmed notices were sent out to the residents effected. Ms. Perry noted their office had not received any public comments.

Council Member Washington inquired into the location of the rehabilitation on Jolly Road, and Ms. Perry replied that it was work that was already done between Pleasant Grove and Wise Road. Mr. Kilpatrick confirmed there were no adjustments.

Other

FY2019/2020 Budget Policies and Priorities

Council Member Spadafore distributed his recommendations and also read Council Member Garza's recommendations:

Public Services Committee:

I would like to see under Public Services priorities, to budget street sweeping once a month. I would also like to see sidewalks, curbs and gutters to be constructed in neighborhoods where there is little to no drainage. I know we are currently in the process of hiring more code enforcement officers, I really would like to see a dedicated 2nd Ward Premise inspector.

Public Safety Committee:

I would like to see under Public Safety priorities, a 2nd Ward Community Police officer. Under policies I would like to make it a prerequisite that before appointment to the Lansing Police Commission one must complete the Citizens Police Academy.

Council Member Spadafore noted the majority of his changes were to formatting for clarity purposes, but he did make one recommendation on page 1, h) which was "The City should analyze systems and technology for efficiencies and opportunities for improvement." He further stated this would be to investigate technology programs that could be incorporated into the current City programs such as taxes and Lansing Connect, to allow better tracking and response. Council Member Washington had no recommendations at this time and stated she would provide her own at the Committee of the Whole meeting.

Council Member Spadafore canceled the September 18th meeting and rescheduled it for September 24th @ 5:00 p.m. where the only agenda item will be the Ordinance that will be holds its public hearing on September 10th on the Residential Parking Zones.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LANSING, MICHIGAN, TO AMEND CHAPTER 404 OF THE LANSING CODIFIED ORDINANCES BY CREATING SECTION 404.11 TO PROVIDE FOR CREATION OF RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING ZONES; TO PROVIDE FOR HOURS OF USE FOR RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING ZONES; TO PROVIDE FOR APPLICATION, PERMITTING, AND PAYMENT RATES FOR RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING ZONES.

THE CITY OF LANSING ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Chapter 404 of the Lansing Code of Ordinances of the City of Lansing is hereby amended to add Section 404.11 as follows:

404.11 – RESIDENTIAL PERMIT FOR STREET PARKING

RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING ZONE REGULATIONS AND RESTRICTIONS, INCLUDING LOCATION, TIME PERIODS, AND OFFICIAL SIGNAGE, SHALL BE ESTABLISHED BY ISSUANCE OF TRAFFIC CONTROL ORDERS IN COMPLIANCE WITH UTC R28.1153 (RULE 153). THE CITY ISSUANCE OF PERMITS FOR RESIDENTIAL PARKING ON STREETS SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION. A PERSON ISSUED A PERMIT UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL COMPLY WITH ALL THE TERMS, CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS OF THE PERMIT AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION.

(A) ADMINISTRATION

THE RESIDENTIAL PERMIT FOR STREET PARKING PROGRAM SHALL BE UNDER THE SUPERVISION AND ADMINISTRATIVE CONTROL OF THE OFFICE OF THE PARKING

1 MANAGER, INCLUDING PREPARATION OF FORMS, RECEIPT OF APPLICATIONS,
2 ISSUANCE OF PERMITS, AND COLLECTION OF FEES.

3 (B) APPLICATION

4 A PERSON REQUESTING A RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING PERMIT FOR THEIR
5 MOTOR VEHICLE SHALL FIRST FULLY AND ACCURATELY PROVIDE A COMPLETED
6 CITY APPLICATION FORM AND UPON REQUEST SUPPLY THE CITY WITH
7 SUPPORTING SUPPLEMENTAL DOCUMENTATION. THE APPLICATION FORM SHALL
8 REQUEST AT A MINIMUM THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 9 1. THE NAME OF THE OWNER OR OPERATOR OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE;
- 10 2. THE PRIMARY RESIDENTIAL ADDRESS OF THE OWNER OR OPERATOR
11 OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE;
- 12 3. THE EMAIL ADDRESS AND CELL PHONE NUMBER OF THE OWNER OR
13 OPERATOR OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE TO BE USED FOR CONTACT IN
14 CASE OF TEMPORARY SUSPENSION FOR SNOW REMOVAL,
15 EMERGENCY OR CONSTRUCTION PURPOSES;
- 16 4. THE MOTOR VEHICLE'S MAKE, MODEL, VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION
17 NUMBER, AND LICENSE PLATE NUMBER.

18 SUPPORTING SUPPLEMENTAL DOCUMENTATION INCLUDES, BUT IS NOT LIMITED
19 TO:

- 20 5. AN EXECUTED LEASE OR OTHER REASONABLE PROOF SHOWING
21 RESIDENCE FOR THE DWELLING UNIT WITHIN THE ZONE FOR WHICH
22 THE PERMIT IS SOUGHT.

1 6. THE CURRENT, VALID REGISTRATION FOR THE MOTOR VEHICLE FOR
2 WHICH THE PERMIT IS BEING APPLIED;

3 a. IF THE APPLICANT FOR A RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING
4 PERMIT IS THE OWNER OF THE VEHICLE SOUGHT TO BE
5 REGISTERED AND HIS/HER PERMANENT RESIDENCE IS AT THE
6 ADDRESS FOR WHICH THE PERMIT IS SOUGHT, THEN SAID
7 VEHICLE SHALL BE REGISTERED AT THE PERMANENT
8 ADDRESS AND SHALL HAVE VALID STATE OF MICHIGAN
9 MOTOR VEHICLE PLATES; OR

10 b. IF THE APPLICANT FOR A RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING
11 PERMIT HAS HIS/HER PERMANENT RESIDENCE AT THE
12 ADDRESS FOR WHICH THE PERMIT IS SOUGHT BUT THE
13 VEHICLE UNDER HIS/HER CONTROL INDICATES ANOTHER
14 ADDRESS OF RESIDENCE FOR THE OWNER OF SAID VEHICLE,
15 THE APPLICANT SHALL BE REQUIRED TO CERTIFY THAT SAID
16 VEHICLE IS KEPT BY THE APPLICANT AND ONLY AT THE
17 ADDRESS FOR WHICH THE PERMIT IS REQUESTED AND THAT IT
18 WILL NOT BE KEPT AT ANY OTHER LOCATION FOR THE
19 DURATION OF THE PERMIT'S VALIDITY.

20 THE PARKING MANAGER IS NOT REQUIRED TO GRANT A PERMIT TO ANY
21 APPLICANT.

22 (C) PERMIT

1 THE PARKING MANAGER MAY ISSUE A PERMIT UPON APPLICATION AND
2 PAYMENT OF THE APPLICABLE FEE, TO THE OWNER OR THE OPERATOR OF A
3 MOTOR VEHICLE WHO RESIDES WITHIN HIS/HER RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING
4 ZONE. PERMITS ARE SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:

- 5 1. THE PERMIT IS VALID ONLY FOR THE MOTOR VEHICLE THAT IT WAS
6 APPLIED FOR;
- 7 2. THE PERMIT SHALL DISPLAY THE MOTOR VEHICLE'S LICENSE PLATE
8 NUMBER AND EXPIRATION DATE, AND THE ZONE WHERE THE PERMIT
9 IS VALID;
- 10 3. THE PERMIT SHALL BE A STICKER THAT IS NOT EASILY REMOVED,
11 AND MUST BE PLACED IN A VISIBLE PLACE ON THE WINDSHIELD OF
12 THE PERMITTED MOTOR VEHICLE;
- 13 4. THE PERMIT IS VALID ONLY WHEN VISIBLY AND PROPERLY
14 DISPLAYED ON THE VEHICLE, WHEN PARKED IN THE DESIGNATED
15 ZONE WHERE THE RESIDENT LIVES;
- 16 5. THE ANNUAL FEE FOR ANY RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING ZONE
17 PERMITS SHALL BE SET BY RESOLUTION OF COUNCIL;
- 18 6. A PERMIT THAT IS GRANTED IS ONLY VALID FOR THE TIME THAT THE
19 OWNER OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE CONTINUES TO RESIDE WITHIN OR
20 ADJACENT TO THE RESIDENTIAL STREET PERMIT PARKING ZONE;
- 21 7. THE FEE SHALL BE PAID ANNUALLY, BUT MAY BE PRO-RATED BY
22 MONTH IF THE APPLICANT CAN ONLY SHOW CONTINUED RESIDENCE

1 IN OR ADJACENT TO THE RESIDENTIAL STREET PERMIT PARKING
2 ZONE FOR LESS THAN A YEAR;

3 8. A REPLACEMENT PERMIT MAY BE ISSUED ONLY IF ALL OR PART OF
4 THE ORIGINAL PERMIT IS PRODUCED AT THE TIME THAT A
5 REPLACEMENT PERMIT IS APPLIED FOR, OR IF PROOF OF THEFT OF
6 THE VEHICLE IS DEMONSTRATED TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE
7 PARKING MANAGER;

8 9. THE FEE FOR ANY REPLACEMENT PERMIT SHALL BE SET BY
9 RESOLUTION OF CITY COUNCIL.

10 (D) CONDITIONS ON THE PERMIT AND PERMIT HOLDER

11 AN OTHERWISE VALID PERMIT IS SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS,
12 WHICH THE PERMIT HOLDER MUST HONOR AND OBEY:

13 1. USE OF A PERMIT SHALL BE RESTRICTED TO STREETS DESIGNATED
14 FOR RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING WITHIN THE DESIGNATED ZONE,
15 AS SET PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION.

16 2. A RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING PERMIT SHALL NOT GUARANTEE
17 OR RESERVE TO THE HOLDER A PARKING SPACE ON STREETS
18 DESIGNATED FOR RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING.

19 3. A RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING PERMIT SHALL NOT EXEMPT THE
20 HOLDER FROM THE OBSERVANCE OF ANY TRAFFIC REGULATION
21 OTHER THAN THE SPECIFIED OVERNIGHT PARKING LIMIT.

- 1 4. RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING PERMITS MAY BE TEMPORARILY
2 SUSPENDED BY THE CITY FOR SNOW REMOVAL, EMERGENCY OR
3 CONSTRUCTION PURPOSES.
- 4 5. THE OWNER OR OPERATOR OF A VEHICLE DISPLAYING A
5 RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING PERMIT SHALL COMPLETELY
6 REMOVE SAID PERMIT IMMEDIATELY UPON ITS EXPIRATION OR
7 TERMINATION.
- 8 6. RESIDENTIAL STREET PARKING PERMITS ARE NOT TRANSFERRABLE
9 TO OTHER PERSONS.
- 10 7. IN THE EVENT A VALID PERMIT HOLDER SELLS, TRANSFERS, OR
11 OTHERWISE DISPOSES OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE FOR WHICH A PERMIT
12 IS GRANTED, THE PERMIT SHALL TERMINATE AUTOMATICALLY.
- 13 8. IF A PERMIT HOLDER DESIRES TO TRANSFER THEIR VALID PERMIT TO
14 A DIFFERENT VEHICLE, THEY MUST MAKE A SUPPLEMENTAL
15 APPLICATION TO THE PARKING MANAGER INDICATING THE CHANGE
16 IN VEHICLE, AND THEY MUST PROVIDE THE ORIGINAL PERMIT AS
17 PROOF THAT IT HAS BEEN REMOVED FROM THE MOTOR VEHICLE FOR
18 WHICH THE PERMIT WAS PREVIOUSLY GRANTED;
- 19 9. ANY PARKING VIOLATION COMMITTED BY A PERMIT HOLDER WILL
20 BE ENFORCED AS SET FORTH IN THIS CHAPTER;
- 21 10. IF A PERMIT HOLDER COMMITS THREE PARKING VIOLATIONS IN THE
22 PARKING ZONE FOR WHICH THEY ARE PERMITTED, THEIR PERMIT
23 MAY BE REVIEWED AND REVOKED BY THE PARKING MANAGER;

1 11. IF A PERMIT HOLDER TRANSFERS THEIR PERMIT TO ANOTHER
2 VEHICLE WITHOUT FOLLOWING THE PROCEDURES IN THIS SECTION,
3 THE PERMIT WILL BE TERMINATED AND REVOKED.

4
5 Section 2. All ordinances, resolutions or rules, parts of ordinances, resolutions or rules
6 inconsistent with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed in their entirety and shall be null and
7 void and of no effect.

8 Section 3. Should any section, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared to be invalid,
9 the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof other than the
10 part so declared to be invalid.

11 Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect on the 30th day after enactment, unless given
12 immediate effect by City Council.
