Chair Lukco facilitated the conversation about updating the 2021 projects matrix map that the board would like to do for the fiscal year July 1st. Shaski gave an update about the murals which still need to be tracked down. The board discussed how to fix vacant property and obsolete property issues on corridors. Brewer added a conversation about potential to slow traffic down on the corridor. The board decided to look at the most recent master plan to see the vision of the City. Board members will plan to walk the corridor to view vacant properties and parcels needing improvements.
