Norma Bauer Lansing resident and representing Black Lives Matter.

CALL TO ORDER - After establishing a quorum, Chairperson Farhat welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 5:34 p.m. Chairperson Fahat led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moment of Silence was observed in honor of Lansing Fire Department Captain Stephen Babcock who passed away on February 3, 2016.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEMS –

Norma Bauer spoke of her activism in the Lansing Community and her involvement with Black Lives Matter. She invited members of the board to attend the 21st Century Policing Forum occurring on March 24, 2016 at the Media Center, 2500 South Washington Ave. at 6:00 p.m. Chief Yankowski has committed to attend. Bauer appreciated Chief Yankowski's leadership and attendance at the forum. The group has sent out surveys to area police agencies thus far only 3 have responded. There is a wide disparity in the opinion of progress between police agencies and community members. Bauer was interested in what the Police Board of Commissioners did. Bauer offered her services to assist the mayor in finding suitable candidates for Commissioners as terms expire.

ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA - None, there were no additions to the Agenda.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION – None

APPROVAL OF MINUTES - The Board reviewed the January, 2016, meeting minutes. The year on the minutes was incorrect. A motion was made to approve the minutes as amended by Vice-Chairperson Noordhoek; supported by Commissioner Kowalk-Thompson; approved unanimously. The minutes of the regular meeting of January, 2016 with the corrected year, were approved and will be placed on file with the Lansing City Clerk's Office.

EDUCATION PRESENTATION –

Officer Kasha Osborn is the Neighborhood Watch Officer with 13.5 years of service with the Lansing Police Department. She provided business cards and phone numbers to the board members. She described her duties to include;

- Community meetings
- Crime Prevention and Safety Tips
- Participates in Youth Programs ie. GREAT program
- Alarms
- Participates in the Citizens Police Academy
- Scheduling McGruff
- Currently 198 Neighborhood Watch groups

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT from Chief Mike Yankowski

- Showed video of Jeremie's thank you party for police. The segment will be showed on Friday Feb 19 at 6:30 on CBS and again on the program "Sunday Morning also on CBS.
- Saturday, February 27, 2016 is a surprise birthday party for Jeremie. He is a special kid with a bigger purpose.
- Thanked Norma Baurer for attending the meeting.

- Gave update on officer involved shooting, case was forwarded to Calhoun County Prosecutors Office for review.
- Gave update on Body camera program, waiting for the new generation to arrive, 120 were ordered. FY17 budget will reflect to enhance program. The program will hold officers and citizens accountable as well as a useful prosecution tool.
- Completed the command wide Procedural Justice training, (8 hours). Other trainings which have occurred or will be occurring are Implicit Bias, Emotional survival and Annual training.
- This year's annual training topics are: Handling of Critical Incidents, Exposure to Biohazards, Use of Force and the Chief discussion on philosophy, expectations and questions
- Chief attended the National PERF conference, along 200 other Chiefs. A group went to Scotland to look at how non-firearm related encounters are handled and best practices. 30 recommendations came out of the research, one was more training.
- LPD is retooling training to provide better training. Chief tasked a committee with this objective. One recommendation would include a Professional Standards Unit.
- Police Officer Hiring Process is continuing with the Interview stage. 25 people in the process now. There are 5 people on the interview panel. Sponsorship process will be submitted for the August academy. This provides the opportunity for a bigger and diverse talent pool. In the previous process 8 candidates passed the interview stage, looking like 1 maybe hired. There will be 2 detention officer openings in July. There are 14 PO1 vacancies.
- Promotional test for the ranks of Sergeant and Detective will be held on February 17, 2016, with interviews in March.
- Lead Detention Officer Gregg Rosenberry resigned. Two new lead Detention Officers were promoted, Robert Davis and Jason Davis.
- Chief attended Active Violence table top event. Reiterated the importance having a plan in place.
- Citizen's Police Academy currently underway. It is free and encourages community members to attend.
- In process of FY17 budget
- Award procedure was revised and includes a new Community Excellence award. Chief provided examples of officers actions befitting this award.

LEGAL ADVISOR UPDATE from Kristen Simmons – None

HUMAN RELATIONS AND COMMUNITY SERVICES LIAISON REPORT from BERNARD BRANTLEY FOR DR. JOAN JACKSON-JOHNSON

- Bernard Brantley will continue as the Police Commission investigator as a contract employee working approximately 20 hours a week. He will continue to take complaints and if necessary work additional hours to complete the investigation. He continues to be a valuable asset responding to citizens issues.
- Magnuson Hotel in Lansing; Police response in December brought this situation to light. Dr. Joan Jackson Johnson brought up several concerns and issues facing families with children and individuals that are residing there, working on what can be repaired and other housing options.
- The mobile food pantry took place at Tabernacle of David Church and First United Methodist.
- Cold weather concerns continue to be addressed by her staff. Good hearts within our community offering coffee, businesses open all night allowing people to come in and sit for as long as they like to stay warm.
- Continues to work to address homeless veterans

Highlights

Central Records – Produced 589 Freedom of Information Act requests for documents compared to 381 February of last year.

Recruiting/Hiring- Police Officer 1 (Certified) interviews took place in the month of Feb. Seventeen (17) candidates participated in the interview process. The hiring process was submitted to HR for Police Recruit positions.

Property and Supply – PSU staff has been researching new inventory management software. PSU conducted a Gun Destruction in the month of February.

Great Program- GREAT was contacted by one of our standing partners, MMLA regarding assistance with a shared collaboration with Dean Transportation where the school faculty and student body have a mission to fill an entire school bus donated by Dean with water to take to Flint as part of the crisis relief effort. MMLA expressed some concern about meeting their goal within their timeline. LPD GREAT donated \$300 in Meijer gift card resource from our 2015 allotment to help them reach their goal.

Planning is underway for the GREAT spring/summer outreach schedule including the Police/ Fire YLA. The baseline GREAT outreach schedule should be ready for review by the Chief sometime in April.

Case Highlights:

Det. Lewandowsky – Homicide Conviction. Dashawn Carter shot and killed Eric Jackson on April 18, 2015 in Mt Vernon. The jury deliberated for over an hour and returned 1ST Degree Murder and Felony Firearm convictions. This was an outstanding team effort by Patrol, VCI, and DB.

Det. Larson – Over the course of a three day span, five Lansing youths engaged in an auto theft and bumper car spree in Lansing and E. Lansing. Patrol, Detective Larson and CSI have policed a half dozen crashes and investigated the theft/recovery of 13 stolen cars at the hands of this group of rebels. Three of the names were suspects in other crimes or have been arrested for this before. Det. Larson has worked closely with the ICPO and the Youth Facility to ensure these young men are held accountable for these serious crimes that put many other lives in danger. There are still more interviews to do and cars to process. Great job Det. Larson and CSI.

Det. St. Aubin – On 2/16 and 2/2016 the same man robbed the Frandor Comerica, Merit Bank in Delhi Twp and Comerica on S. Cedar. A heads up witness helped crack the case providing integral information to Patrol. This led them to the 1000 blk of Bensch where they ultimately took, James Michael Cole, 47yoa in to custody for Bank Robbery. He was a note passing MO. Evidence connecting him to all three robberies was obtained. Det. St. Aubin has worked closely with the FBI who have sponsored a federal indictment on Cole. Great job Patrol, CSI and St. Aubin.

Det. Nevins – Domestic partner and Child abuse. Det. Nevins obtained a 5 count felony warrant that included 2 counts of 2nd degree child abuse, 1 count 4th degree child abuse, 1 count mental harm to a child and 1 count habitual offender, on Terry Roland, 45yoa in early February. Officer Vaughn was sent to a domestic call on 1/30/16 and very astutely uncovered this abusive situation of the mother and her three children. That day was the worst abuse to date, where children traumatized with physical force, a door, a broom sick and a large

butcher knife. The children were 2, 4, and 6 years of age. Det. Nevins and the SVU put another bad guy doing bad things, behind bars.

- Drug Search Warrant - LLA160229002043 - Special Operations Section obtained a drug search warrant in the area of 1200 block of Shepard. Several items of evidence were seized including: cocaine, heroin, packaging material, a digital scale and \$497 in US currency. Both males were lodged at the Lansing Police Department Detention. One subject was lodged for PWID Cocaine & Heroin and Maintaining a Drug House. The other subject was lodged for Frequenting a Drug House. Neighbors expressed a sense of relief that the house was raided and the occupants were arrested.

- Drug Search Warrant -- LLA160218001680 - Special Operations Section received information about a drug house in the 3500 block of W Jolly Road. Officers (Patrol and VCI) assigned to problem solving conducted a knock and talk at this location and observed evidence of drug activity. SOS was contacted to assist by authoring the search warrant and completing the investigation. Several items of evidence including a large quantity of cocaine and heroin and drug paraphernalia consistent with delivery were seized. \$2,153 in US currency was also forfeited. Two women were lodged at the Lansing Police Department Detention on the following charges: PWID Cocaine, PWID Heroin, Maintaining a Drug House and Possession of Marijuana.
- Drug Search Warrant - LLA160208001337 - Special Operations Section obtained a drug search warrant for a house in the 4900 block of Richmond Street. START executed the warrant with the assistance of Patrol as perimeter. Two women were found inside and secured. A search of the residence resulted in the discovery of several items of evidence including: a digital scale, cocaine, residency, and \$242. Both females were lodged at the Lansing Police Department Detention. One female was charged with PWID Cocaine and Maintaining a Drug House. The other female was lodged for Maintaining a Drug House.
- Drug Search Warrant - LLA160203001160 - Special Operations Section obtained a drug search warrant for a residence in the 3700 block of Malibu. START executed the warrant with the assistance of VCI. One male subject was found inside. A search of the residence resulted in the seizure of numerous items of evidence including heroin and packaging paraphernalia. The occupant was lodged on outstanding warrants. Charges are being sought on the Accused, who was not present.
- Prostitution Stings - On Thursday 02-11-2016 the Lansing Police Special Operations section, VCI, and an Eaton County Sheriff Detective participated in a joint prostitution enforcement initiative. Our team of Investigators was deployed in an effort to take proactive measures against prostitution within the City of Lansing. The operation centered on Backpage Internet Prostitution Stings. Three hotel rooms were obtained in south Lansing to facilitate undercover operations into internet escort services. SOS Officers attempted over 50 contacts with local females posting escort services on Backpage. SOS officers made four felony arrests during the evening; each of the females were arrested on both solicitation and Computer crime charges. Interviews were conducted on all subjects for any evidence of human sex trafficking and local prostitution intelligence. This was a very worthwhile multi-agency enforcement effort.

- LLA160204001211 -2/6/16-VCI officers responded to a I-Bulletin for HUNTER who was wanted for felony assault and was alleged to be in possession of a hand gun. Officers conducted numerous hours of surveillance at several residences over the course of a week. Finally, officers spoke to the homeowner who initially denied the accused was present. After being presented with additional information, she admitted the accused was in the house. Upon giving commands, the accused came upstairs and surrendered. VCI officers then obtained consent to search the house and discovered a stolen handgun from three days earlier. Charges of possession were denied however officers have follow up planned with the owner of the gun who is an associate of the accused.
- LLA160218001680 -VCI officers assisted Sector 3 and CPO's for a problem solving event. Ofc. Forbis made contact at 3530 W Jolly in regards to a drug tip. Once inside, Ofc. Hall responded and assisted in controlling the scene. Through their investigation, officers drafted a search warrant which was executed with the assistance of SOS. In total, over an ounce of heroin and an ounce of cocaine was recovered along with packaging. Additional, money and other items were seized. This cooperative effort between patrol, VCI and SOS paid dividends and was the first attempt at such effort.
- LLA160222001818 - A summary can hardly serve the work done on this case by Officer Hall, Det. Lewandowsky and the support of other VCI members. Witness intimidation charges, false identity and bringing a murder to justice resulted herein. This was done through technology, perseverance, and team work.
- VCI conducted 10 MDOC home visits after 2300 hrs in an effort to address several problematic subjects

- VCI officers put a lot of time and effort into Doran Duncan who besides having multiple warrants was needed by DB regarding a serious child torture case. He was located as a direct result of officers continually reaching out to known family and associates.
- VCI officers conducted surveillance and arrested accused Riggle who was wanted for armed home invasion in an i-bulletin

LLA160223001840 Knock & Talk, Poss of Narc Equip– 200 blk N. Penn

On 02/23/16 at approximately 10:00 hrs. **Officer Rob Forbis and Officer Tanner Lewandowsky**, were in DDACTS area, following up on a tip of drug activity at a residence/apartment in the 200 blk of N. 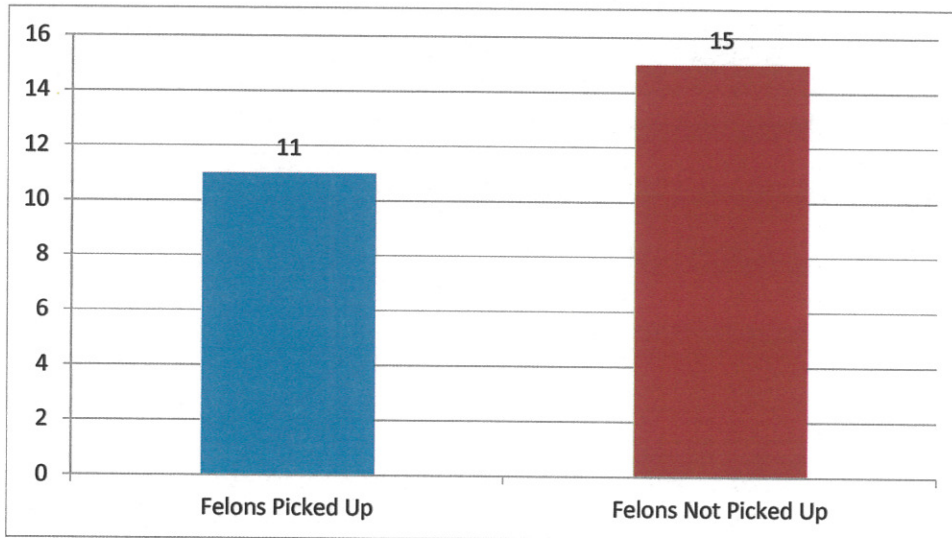

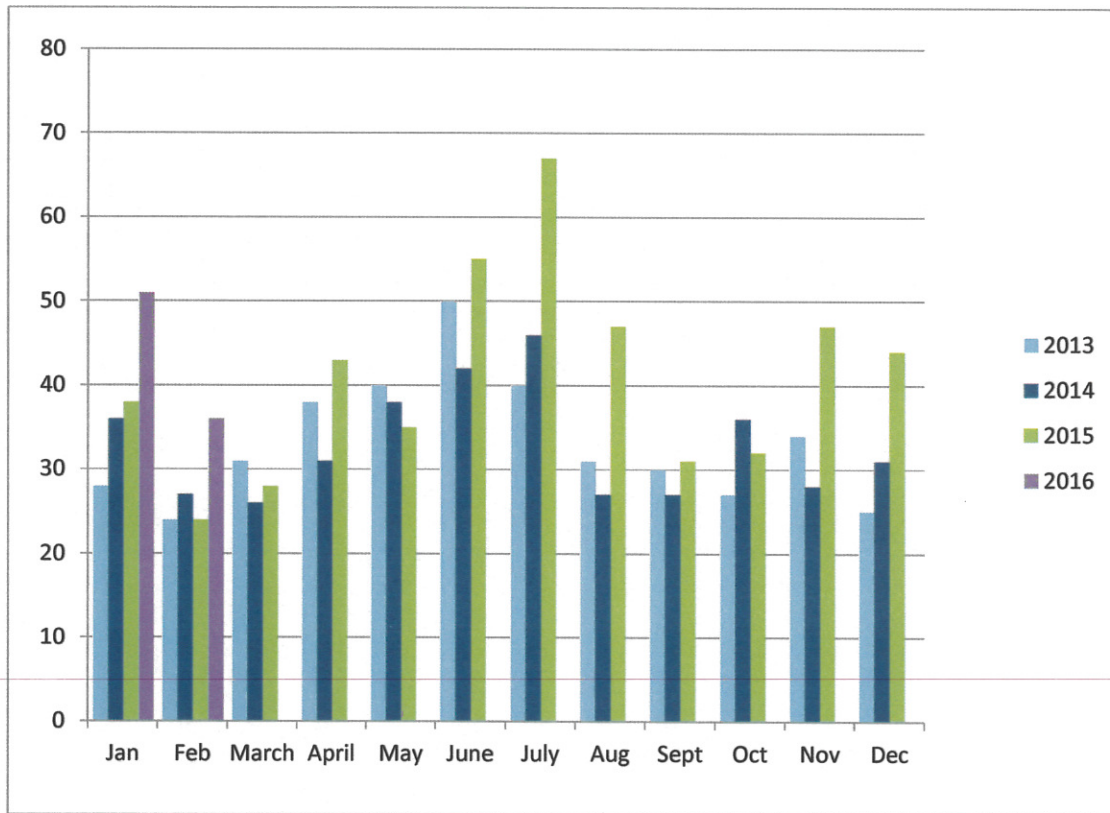
