WHEREAS, the National Health Center Week is celebrated across the country each August to increase awareness about the mission of America's Health Centers and their accomplishments; and

WHEREAS, Community Health Centers are a valuable part of their communities and have been providing primary care and supportive services for over 50 years to underserved areas and populations. Care is provided without regard to insurance status or ability to pay, and the demand for services provided is increasing; and

WHEREAS, studies have shown that Community Health Centers are 8.4% more efficient in providing Medicaid services than other providers which equates to a \$15.9 million per year savings to the Medicaid Program of Michigan; and

WHEREAS, the Ingham County Health Center (IHC) has eight (8) locations across Ingham County and serves over 24,000 patients that may be low-income, uninsured, underinsured, elderly, minority, migrant, seasonal farm workers, homeless, or who have HIV/AIDS. The IHC works in partnership with Lansing's hospital systems, the Community Mental Health Authority, Lansing School District, and various public health programs within the Health Department to accomplish its mission

providing primary health care, dental services, women's healthcare, pediatric healthcare, chronic disease management, on-site lab, immunizations, nutrition counseling, health education, risk education, behavioral health, substance use disorder treatment, pharmacy services, and school-based health care; and

WHEREAS, the Community Health Centers have a positive economic benefit to the communities in which they serve by providing stable employment and job training, purchasing goods and services, and engage in capital development projects.

THEREFORE; LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Lansing City Council joins the rest of the country in celebrating National Health Center Week, August 12-18, 2018 to recognize the importance of the health care heroes who live and breathe the health center mission and exceed the call of duty to support health centers in providing quality health care for patients in the community.

ORDINANCE #1232

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LANSING, MICHIGAN, TO REPEAL CHAPTER 1034, SECTION 1034.01 THROUGH 1034.09, TO ELIMINATE THE MEMORIAL REVIEW BOARD, ITS DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS, AND TO CANCEL THE PROCESS AND PROCEDURE FOR NAMING OR RENAMING PUBLIC MEMORIALS CONTAINED IN THE EXISTING CHAPTER AND TO PROVIDE A NEW REPLACEMENT CHAPTER 1034 TO DEFINE RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER THE CHARTER AND LAW FOR THE NAMING OR RENAMING OF STREETS AND PUBLIC AMENITIES.

THE CITY OF LANSING ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Chapter 1034, Section 1034.01-1034.09, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Lansing, Michigan, be and are hereby repealed in their entirety and shall be null and void and of no effect AND SHALL BE REPLACED WITH A NEW CHAPTER 1034 AS SET FORTH BELOW:

1034.01. – PURPOSE

THE PURPOSE OF THIS CHAPTER 1034 IS TO DEFINE THE RESPONSIBILITIES FOR THE NAMING OR RENAMING OF STREETS AND PUBLIC AMENITIES.

1034.02. – DEFINITIONS

(A) AS USED IN THIS CHAPTER, PUBLIC AMENITY(IES) MEANS A PUBLIC BUILDING, PARK, GARDEN, SCULPTURE, BRIDGE, BUILDING, ROOM, BALLFIELD, AND OTHER RELATED AMENITY, ACCESSORY, OR FACILITY WITHIN PARKS, PUBLIC SPACES, AND PUBLIC FACILITIES, SUCH AS A BENCH, DUGOUT, MARKER, OR EQUIPMENT.

1034.03. – RESPONSIBILITIES

(A) STREETS AND ESTABLISHED PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY ARE HELD FOR THE PUBLIC IN TRUST. THE LANSING CITY COUNCIL IS DESIGNATED WITH THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE NAMING OR RENAMING OF PUBLIC STREETS AND PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY.

(B) THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF LANSING IS NAMED AS MANAGER OF REAL PROPERTY OF THE CITY BY THE CHARTER AND IS THEREBY DESIGNATED WITH THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE NAMING OR RENAMING OF PUBLIC AMENITIES. THIS DESIGNATION INCLUDES, BY IMPLICATION, SOLICITING PRIVATE OR PUBLIC DONATIONS DIRECTED TOWARD THE CONSTRUCTION OF, ENHANCEMENT TO, OR MAINTENANCE OF, PUBLIC AMENITIES.

(C) PRIOR TO THE NAMING OR RENAMING OF A PUBLIC STREET OR PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY, THE PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD SHALL REVIEW THE PROPOSAL AND SHALL MAKE ITS RECOMMENDATION TO THE LANSING CITY COUNCIL. PRIOR TO THE NAMING OR RENAMING OF ANY PUBLIC AMENITY, THE PARK BOARD SHALL REVIEW THE PROPOSAL AND SUBMIT ITS RECOMMENDATION TO THE MAYOR.

Section 2. All ordinances, resolutions or rules, parts of ordinances, resolutions or rules inconsistent with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed in their entirety and shall be null and void and of no effect.

Section 3. Should any section, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof other than the part so declared to be invalid.

Section 4. This ordinance repeal shall take effect on the 30th day

after enactment, unless given immediate effect by City Council.
